Subject of Report	LGR Programme Budget			
Executive Summary	In February 2017 a submission was sent to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government requesting all Dorset councils are replaced by two new unitary councils. The submission contained financial analysis from Local Partnerships which demonstrated annual savings of approximately £28m could be made as a result of the reorganisation. Local Partnerships accepted some of these savings would be taken before the new unitary councils were created, as a response to reductions in the finance available to local government. Therefore, they reduced the estimated annual savings by 35% to £18m. Local Partnerships estimated the cost of making the change to be in the order of £25m, of which £13.2m relates to Dorset Council have previously been asked to release funding to finance the preparations for the creation of the new council. In the summer of 2017 councils released funding of £1,215,000 and this was supplemented by a further release of £2,163,000 in June 2018. At its meeting on 17 December 2018, the Shadow Executive considered the highlight report for the programme to create the new council. The highlight report indicated a further £1,859,000 will be spent before the 1 April on the creation of Dorset Council. This brings the total to be spent before 1 April 2019 to £5.24m. The Shadow Executive agreed the report, including a			

	recommendation to ask the predecessor councils to release further funding.
	This extra expenditure in the current financial year will result in savings being made earlier than anticipated such as from convergence, early departure for some executives and implementing some structural changes. Early changes such as this are beneficial as it allows the Council to make more savings in total through moving expenditure from next year to this.
	Dorset County Council has currently set aside a total of £3.261m to meet LGR programme costs. After estimated commitments the anticipated unspent balance at 31 March 2019 was expected to be between £530k and £670k.
	Dorset County Council's share of the additional costs approved by the Shadow Executive is 50% or £930k. There is therefore the need for approval of expenditure of up to a further £400k of programme expenditure to meet the revised anticipated costs in 2018-19.
	This will then be sufficient to cover all of Dorset County Council's share of programme costs in 2018-19. All further programme costs for 2019-20 will however need to be met by Dorset Council as there will be no residual LGR funding set aside by Dorset County Council to transfer to the new authority.

	An additional cost of £930k will be incurred by the County Council in respect of the LGR programme during 2018-19. This can be partially funded from funds already approved for LGR but will leave a shortfall of between £260k and £400k. This will need to be funded through a reduction in the general balances of the County Council.
