CQC Visits and Betty Highwood Ward

Report to provide an update on CQC Inspections and closure of Betty Highwood Unit.

PURPOSE OF THE PAPER

This paper will provide an update on Care Quality Commission visits to Dorset HealthCare Adult and Older Peoples Mental Health Units and the closure of Betty Highwood Ward.

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1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Dorset Overview and Scrutiny Committee have requested an update regarding recent inspections of inpatient mental health services, operated by Dorset HealthCare.
- 1.2 This report will detail visits and improvements made since the last report to Committee in September 2013.
- 2 Betty Highwood (Blandford): <u>Date Inspected:</u> 8th March 2013

- 2.1 Betty Highwood is a 12 bedded unit in Blandford Community Hospital, providing acute care for older people with organic illnesses. The Care Quality Commission (CQC) made an unannounced inspection of the ward in April 2013 and raised concerns about agency staff, with no long term knowledge of patients, being left in charge of the ward. Dorset Healthcare took immediate action and the ward was temporarily closed pending resolution of staffing problems. The five patients and staff on the ward at the time were relocated to Chalbury Ward in Weymouth.
- 2.2The decision to merge the wards was taken on the basis that there was less than 50% occupancy of Betty Highwood (5 patients) and the needs of these patients could be better met on Chalbury Ward; the number of beds available on Chalbury ward was increased from 14 to 18 to help accommodate these additional patients. The additional transfer of staff from Betty Highwood would enhance the number of employed nurses available to look after all patients and reduce use of agency.
- 2.3 Dorset Healthcare undertook a county wide recruitment drive which included multi-media coverage, two recruitment open days and an UK wide search for staff (see Recruitment below). Recruitment has resulted in the employment of only one additional qualified nurse and regretfully, the temporary closure has been extended for 6 months whilst further recruitment drives are undertaken. All staff have been informed. Whilst the ward is closed to Mental Health patients, it will be temporarily used to delivery physical healthcare.

3 Chalbury Ward (Weymouth):

Date Inspected: December 2012 and June 2013

3.1 The Care Quality Commission (CQC) carried out an inspection of Chalbury Ward on 30th June 2013 to check whether the ward complied with the standards below. A copy of the inspection report is attached at Appendix A.

5 Linden (Weymouth):

Date Inspected: 24th April 2013

5.1 The Care Quality Commission visited on 24th April 2013 and raised minor concerns in relation to Staffing and Assessment and Monitoring Quality. An action plan was agreed with the CQC and all actions have been completed with the exception of recruitment of one qualified nurse for which recruitment attempts continue.

6 St Ann's Hospital 2013

6.1 The Care Quality Commission (CQC) made a routine inspection of five wards of the six wards at St Ann's Hospital, on 5th February 2013. This visit was a routine, unannounced inspection. A copy of the inspection report is attached at Appendix A and findings set out in the table below.
