Earlier this year, Healthwatch Dorset published the findings of its investigation into Primary Care Dental Services in Dorset

(www.healthwatchdorset.co.uk/resources/primary-care-dental-services-dorset).

Among the issues identified as needing attention were: difficulties receiving information, difficulties accessing a dentist (especially for people with particular needs), issues with referrals for specialist treatment and issues about charges. Healthwatch Dorset made nine recommendations for action. As a result, NHS England Wessex has developed a draft plan outlining eight actions they intend to take to address these issues. They are also now engaging with Healthwatch Dorset to identify how patient feedback can be embedded into contract management and commissioning of dental services. Once their action plan has been finalised, it will be in the public domain.

Following the publication of the Healthwatch Dorset report on Dental Services, we were contacted by a Dorset GP who told us that many GPs are concerned about access to treatment for people suffering acute dental pain, with people being signposted to the wrong services. We subsequently gathered evidence on this issue from nearly 30 GPs across the county. We have shared this evidence with NHS England and with Dorset CCG and they are currently in the process of tracking down where the fault lies in the system.

One other issue that was brought to our attention, this time by local voluntary groups, following the publication of our Dental Services report is that of access to dental services for homeless people. As a result, we set up a meeting between Healthwatch Dorset, NHS England Wessex commissioners and a local charity working with homeless people. Commissioners were able to hear directly of homeless people's experiences and difficulties in accessing dental services and, in response, are now developing actions to address the issues.

Healthwatch Dorset will be publishing an update on our work around dental services in the autumn, which will report on the outcomes of all the pieces of work outlined above.
