







STURMINSTER **NEWTON WALKABOUTS**

WALKABOUT 1 Gotts Corner / Honeymead Lane / **Butts Pond Meadows**

A varied walk with features of interest in Sturminster Newton, both past and present (approx. 1.5 miles).

This is one of a series of circular walks from Sturminster Newton which take in the surrounding area of the Blackmore Vale. They are mainly on Public Rights of Way, with some on paths with access permitted by the landowners.

These walks are intended to encourage exploration and appreciation of the variety and beauty of the countryside in this locality, on foot. Cyclists are not permitted to ride on public footpaths and by law must give way to walkers and horseriders on bridleways.

When walking, please remember the Countryside Code, particularly:

- · respect the local community, farmland and others enjoying the countryside
- · leave gates and property as you find them
- · leave no trace of your visit and take your litter home
- keep dogs under effective control
- · keep to the marked paths and cause no damage to crops, livestock or wildlife

Appropriate footwear is recommended, since wet or muddy conditions can be encountered at any time.




