Background

A TEN was served on the Licensing Authority on 15 July 2019, notifying them of the premises users' intent to undertake licensable activities namely, the retail sale of alcohol on the premises and the provision of regulated entertainment at the above venue on the following dates:

Friday 2 August
Saturday 3 August
Sunday 4 August
2200 hours to 0300 hours
2200 hours to 0300 hours
2200 hours to 0300 hours

The TEN has been served to allow for club nights at the venue as there is not a current premises licence in place.

- An Objection Notice has been served by Dorset Police within the statutory three working days consultation period under the licensing objectives namely Prevention of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety. At the time of writing this report the Police haven't provided any complimentary or supporting information regarding their objection. The notice is attached at Appendix 2.
- The premises user, Mr Mead has requested mediation with Dorset Police with regards to a potential modification of notice which may allow the proposed licensable activities to proceed. A TEN can be modified (for example, reduction in duration of activities) only by Police or Environmental Health after mediation in agreement with the premises user. At the time of writing this report the Police have not entered into mediation with the premises user.
- 9 The venue was previously a licensed establishment that held a premises licence between 24 November 2005 and 16 January 2019 when the licence was surrendered by the licence holder. A copy of this can be seen at Appendix 3.

I write to confirm that your notification for a Temporary Event Notice has been received and processed. Please find enclosed the acknowledgement returned to you.

You must ensure that a copy of the notice endorsed as acknowledged by the licensing authority is either prominently displayed at the premises or that it is presentable on request.

It should also be noted that the following, amongst others, are offences under the Licensing Act 2003

the sale or supply of alcohol to children under 18 years of age (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 5 on the standard scale, currently £5,000);

allowing the sale of alcohol to children under 18 (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 5 on the standard scale, currently £5,000);

knowingly allowing the consumption of alcohol on the premises by a person aged under 18 (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 5 on the standard scale, currently £5,000);

allowing disorderly behaviour on the premises (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 3 on the standard scale, currently £1,000);

the sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 3 on the standard scale, currently £1,000);

obtaining alcohol for a person who is drunk (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 3 on the standard scale, currently £1,000);

knowingly allowing a person aged under 18 to make any sale or supply of alcohol unless the sale or supply has been specifically approved by the premises user or any individual aged 18 or over who has been authorised for this purpose by the premises user (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 1 on the standard scale, currently £200); and

knowingly keeping or allowing to be kept on the premises any smuggled goods which have been imported without payment of duty or which have otherwise been unlawfully imported (maximum fine on conviction is a fine up to level 3 on the standard scale, currently £1,000).

All temporary event notices are given subject to a mandatory condition requiring that where the licensable activities involve the supply of alcohol, all such supplies must be made by or under the authority of the named premises user. If there is a breach of this condition, the premises user and the individual making the supply in question would be liable to prosecution.

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

Supply of Alcohol (s19(2)&(3))

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence has been suspended

Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence

Security (s21(a))

2. Any individual carrying out a security activity must be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001 or be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of that Act.

Drinks Promotions

- (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 (2)The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person must ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."

- 7. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 8. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula- P=D+(DxV)
 - (i) P is the permitted price,
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol:
 - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
 - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 9. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub- paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 10. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 8 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the Licensing Authority

1. All external doors/windows must be kept closed other than for access/egress when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place.

- 2. The licensee or nominated representative shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all events involving amplified music or speech.
- 3. All staff to be trained at induction and receive refresher training on the procedure to be followed on the handling of complaints from members of the public arising when any regulated entertainment is taking place. A record of training undertaken should be entered on their personnel file.

Conditions attached after a review hearing on 26 August 2009

- 4. All drink glasses and bottles whether supplied or otherwise used within the premises shall at all times after the 19th August 2010 be made of polycarbonate and polyethylene terephthalate (PET) respectively or such other material(s) as has been approved in writing by the Licensing Authority.
- 5. At all times that any licensable activity is taking place at the premises no bottle or drinking glass shall either be brought into the premises or removed from the premises by any member of the public.
- 6. At all times after the 19th October 2009 there shall be permanently erected at least two signs one outside and one inside the premises of sufficient size and colour to be clearly visible and legible to every member of the public when they enter and leave the premises (respectively) which identifies that no bottle or drinking glass should be brought into the premises or removed from the premises.
- 7. The total capacity of the premises shall not exceed 480 persons at any time, such total to include all performers, guests and staff.
- 8. At all times that any licensable activity is being carried out at the premises there shall be employed and working at the premises no less than one individual per seventy persons (or part thereof) within the premises to carry out security activities ("Security Staff"). For the purposes herein "security activities" means any of the following activities; guarding premises against unauthorized access or occupation, against outbreaks of disorder or against damage.
- 9. All security staff employed and working at the premises should, at all times, wear yellow fluorescent coloured high visibility clothing as their outermost piece of apparel. (amended on 10/4/2017 following a review).
- 10. (1) All staff:
 - (a) before first carrying out any duties at the premises; and

(b) at least every six months thereafter,

shall at least receive training regarding their legal responsibilities in respect of the supply of alcohol

(2) a written record of:

the nature of the training provided;

ii. the staff to whom training is has been provided; and

iii. the date that the training was provided,

shall be kept up to date and at the premises at all times and made available without unreasonable delay upon request by any authorised officer of the Licensing Authority, Dorset County Council or the Police.

- 11. (1) At all times after the 19th October 2009 when any licensable activity is taking place at the premises to which a person aged under eighteen might be admitted there shall be in operation measures which ensure that any person supplying alcohol at the premises can clearly visually identify whether a person is under the age of eighteen.
 - (2) Written details of the measures that are in operation shall before the expiry date specified above have been received by the Licensing Authority.
 - (3) Any change to the measures shall be received in writing by the Licensing Authority prior to commencement, such notification of change to include the date of implementation.
- 12. At all times after the 19th October 2009 there shall be permanently erected at least one sign in each of the following locations of sufficient size and colour to be clearly visible and legible: (1)at every location where alcohol is supplied:
 - (2) at the entrance to the premises; and
 - (3) within every male and female toilet area.
 - identifying that it is a criminal offence:
 - a) for an individual under eighteen to buy or attempt to buy alcohol;
 - b) for a person to buy or attempt to buy alcohol on behalf of an individual aged under eighteen;
 - c) for a person under eighteen to knowingly consume alcohol on the premises; and
 - d) to sell or allow the sale of alcohol to a person under the age of eighteen.
- 13. (1) At all times after the 19th October 2009 when any licensable activity is taking place at the premises to which a person under eighteen might be admitted, there shall be employed and working at the premises measures to identify and control any incidence of alcohol being consumed by any individual aged under eighteen within the area to which this licence relates.
 - (2) The measures referred to above shall in particular secure arrangements for a

permanent written record to be kept on the premises that:

- (a) contains the date and time of any inspection made to identify such consumption and the name of the person carrying out any such inspection;
- (b) contains details of every incidence identified of alcohol being consumed by any person under the age of eighteen and any action taken in relation to it; and
- (c) has been fully updated at least once every twenty four hours; and
- (d)is made available as soon as reasonably practicable upon request by any authorised officer of the Licensing Authority, Dorset County Council or Police.
- (3) Written details of the measures that are in operation shall before the expiry date specified above have been received by the Licensing Authority.
- (4) Any change to the measures shall be received in writing by the Licensing Authority prior to commencement, such notification of change to include the date of implementation.
- 14. (1) Prior to 9th October 2009 there shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Licensing Authority details of measures for the dispersal of members of the public leaving the premises ("the Dispersal Policy").
 - (2) After the 9th December 2009 no licensable activity shall be carried out at the premises unless at the time of that activity the premises is being operated in accordance with the Dispersal Policy or such other Policy as may be subsequently approved in writing by the Licensing Authority
- 15. No food or drink from the building to which this licence relates shall be sold or supplied to any person outside that building at any time.
- 16. (1) At all times after the 19th October 2009 when any licensable activity is taking place at the premises there shall be in operation measures to identify, control and prevent access to the premises of any individual who is drunk.
 - (2) Written details of the measures that are in operation shall before the expiry date specified above have been received by the Licensing Authority.
 - (3) Any change to the measures shall be received in writing by the Licensing Authority prior to commencement, such notification of change to include the date of implementation.

17. CCTV

A Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) system will be operational at the premises at all times when licensable activities are being carried out and at any other times when members of the public are present on the premises.

The CCTV system will cover all areas of the premises occupied by the public under the terms of the licence (licensed areas), including corridors and stairways (excluding WCs and changing rooms).

The CCTV system will cover the main entrance/s and exit/s and designated emergency egress routes from the premises.

The CCTV system will cover all external areas of the premises occupied by the public, i.e. queuing areas, beer gardens, smoking areas and car parks.

The location of CCTV cameras are identified on the site plan of the premises. No amendments to the locations of the cameras will be made without prior consultation with Dorset Police and the Licensing Authority

The CCTV system will be of a resolution quality which will enable the identification of persons and activities, and other fine details such as vehicle registration number plates in any light condition.

The CCTV system will contain the correct time and date stamp information.

The CCTV system will have sufficient storage retention capacity for a minimum of 31 days' continuous footage.

The CCTV footage will be controlled and kept in a secure environment to prevent tampering or unauthorised viewing. A record will be kept of who has accessed the system, the reason why and when. This record must be made available to Police/Licensing on request.

A designated member/members of staff at the premises will be authorised to access the CCTV footage and be conversant with operating the CCTV system. At the request of an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority (under the Licensing Act 2003) any CCTV footage, as requested, will be downloaded immediately or secured to prevent any overwriting. The CCTV footage material will be supplied, on request, to an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or a Responsible Authority with the absolute minimum of delay.

The CCTV system will be capable of securing relevant pictures for review or

export at a later date.

The CCTV system will be adequately maintained and be capable of transporting recorded material onto a removable media.

The CCTV system replay software must allow an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority or Responsible Authority to search the picture footage effectively and see all the information contained in the picture footage.

It must be possible to replay exported files immediately e.g. no re-indexing of files or verification checks.
