This enables the Returning Officer to fulfil the statutory responsibility under the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013 to complete a formal review of their parliamentary polling districts and their polling places and ensuring polling districts, polling places and polling stations used are accessible, practicable and appropriate.

To consider responses to the consultation on the statutory review of polling districts, polling places and polling stations within Dorset and to approve the proposed arrangements. The council has a duty to carry out a review every 5 years in accordance with the Electoral Registration and Administration Act 2013.

### 7. What did this tell you?

That some polling stations, where possible, require some adaptations e.g. doorbells to ensure electors can get the attention of staff if required to access the polling station.

There are some polling stations which, we believe, need additional equipment to ensure electors are able to get into the polling station if they require. E.g. in some instances, the door is not visible to polling station staff and if electors need assistance then portable doorbells will be provided so that electors can ring for assistance. These are:

Please provide a summary of the impacts:

- Polling stations are provided at a location within a designated polling district that electors are able to get to. We understand that not everyone can get to the polling station due to their personal circumstances and may vote by other means, e.g. post or proxy.
- In some locations 20 locations have been highlighted as possibly having the need for doorbells to be provided. These help electors grab the attention of polling station staff. In some locations the entrance cannot be seen from the polling station and this way staff can help electors e.g. by opening doors if they need to. All doorbells will be placed at the correct height to ensure that those electors who may be in a wheelchair for example are able to use the doorbell. In some areas the local community like to use the community halls, or there may not be other polling stations available particularly in some of the rural areas where venues are limited.
- 4 polling stations have been highlighted as having either requiring ramps or handrails to enable electors to gain access to the polling station where they are not already in place.
- Additional lighting will be provided in some polling stations.
- Where possible, schools are not used to minimise disruption. Where schools have been used, they are able to keep the polling station separate from the school.
