I would like to add some points to be added aswell as our concerns about antisocial behaviour in our street

1.it mentions on the shop front a licence for up to midnight on and off premises. As far as iam aware of the premises does not have any outside premises, it fronts a road and pedestrian pavement, which as residents we need to access our property along the road,so shouldn't be serving outside.

2.where is the increased refuse going to go,the bins in cook row are already overused and the refuse lorries wake us up at 6am going down church street and have already damaged our neighbours property. If there are successful can you make them make sure that any lorries go through the cornmarket from West Street and stop at cookrow to empty the bins and then out on to the high street.

3.lately all 3 business in church street have getting the street closed down for street parties, we don't mend when wimborne council do it but these are doing it for pure profit and for us residents when it happens we can't access our property and we can't sleep at night because of noise from the street parties. We don't even get informed of road closures from them properly. I have complained to dorset highways about the constant use of road closures for street parties.

4.the police have had to be called from us on 2 occasions for a antisocial behaviour in church street at weekends because of excess drinking and very nasty assault last October outside our house
