THE LICENSING ACT 2003 (HEARINGS) REGULATIONS 2005

Rights of a Party

- 1. A party has the right to attend the hearing and may be represented by any person.
- 2. A party is entitled to give further information where the authority has asked for clarification.
- 3. A party can question another party, and/or address the authority, with consent of the authority.

Failure to Attend

- 4. If the authority is informed a party does not wish to attend, the hearing may proceed in their absence.
- 5. If a party has not indicated their attendance and fails to attend the hearing may be adjourned if considered in the public interest, or hold the hearing ensuring the party's representation is considered.
- 6. Where the authority adjourns the hearing it shall notify the parties of the date, time and place.

Procedural Information

- 7. At the start of the hearing, the authority shall explain the procedure which it proposes to follow and shall consider any request for permission for another person to appear at the hearing.
- 8. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that it is required.
- 9. The authority will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to speak.
- 10. The authority may require any person behaving disruptively to leave, and may refuse that person to return, but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit in writing information they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

FOOTNOTE:

In relation to all other matters governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005 any party or their representative may contact the Licensing Services at Dorset Council and they will be provided with a full copy of the regulations on request.

LICENSING SUB-COMMITTEE PROCEDURE

- 1. At the start of the meeting the Chairman will introduce:
 - the members of the sub-committee
 - the council officers present
 - the parties and their representatives
- 2. The Chairman will then deal with any appropriate agenda items.
- 3. The Licensing Officer will be asked to outline the details of the application, including details of any withdrawn representations.
- 4. The applicant or their representative is then invited to present their case.
- 5. Committee members will be invited to ask questions.
- 6. Where appropriate the Responsible Bodies e.g. representatives of Police, Fire Services, Environmental Services or Trading Standards will be invited to address the sub-committee on any relevant representations they may have.
- 7. The Chairman may then allow an opportunity for questions.
- 8. The Chairman will ask any person who has made representations, who have already expressed a wish to do so, to address the sub-committee. The sub-committee will have read all the papers before them, including any letters of representation. Members of the public are asked to keep their comments concise and to the point.
- 9. All parties will be given the opportunity to "sum up" their case.
- 10. The Chairman will ask the Legal Advisor if all relevant points have been addressed before advising all parties present that the sub-committee will withdraw from the meeting to consider its decision in private. The sub-committee will be accompanied by the Democratic Services Officer and the Legal Advisor can be called upon to offer legal guidance.
- 11. On returning the Chairman will:
 - Notify all those present of the sub-committee's decision (or indicate when it will be made)

- Give brief details of any conditions attached to the licence approval; Or
- Outline the reasons for the refusal
- Inform that detailed reasons will follow in writing (unless given on the day)
- Inform those present of their right to appeal to the Magistrates' Court

NOTE

The Chairman may vary this procedure, as circumstances require but will have regard to the rules of natural justice and the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations 2005.

The meeting will take place in public. However, the public can be excluded from all or part of the meeting where the sub-committee considers that the public interest in so doing outweighs the public interest in the meeting or that part of the meeting, taking place in public.

Under no circumstances must the parties or their witnesses offer the subcommittee information in the absence of the other parties.

10. Details

- 10.1. Jason Dellbridge has applied for a new premises licence for Waters Edge Café, 19 Coombe Street, Lyme Regis, DT7 3PR.
- 10.2. The description of the premises within the application form is for a small café predominantly selling cold food and hot and cold drinks for consumption both on and off the premises. The full application and plans for the premises are attached at appendix 1.
- 10.3. The application was originally to permit the on-sale of alcohol during the hours of: -

Every day 11:00 to 21:00

With the opening hours at the premises of 08:00 to 21:00.

- 10.4. The application has been advertised on the premises, in a newspaper and the Council's web site.
- 10.5. One representation has been received objecting to the application. The representation relates to the opening hours and people sitting in the outside area. The representation is included in full at appendix 2.
- 10.6. Following receipt of the representations the applicants has responded to the points raised, and reduced the times of alcohol sales to

Every day 11:00 to 17:00

The responses from the applicant's agent is attached in full at appendix 3.

10.7. The change to the times was communicated to the party who made the representation, who have in turn responded that they wish to continue with their representation due to the potential impact of people drinking in the outside area of the premises. The response is attached in full at appendix 4.

11. Considerations

11.1. Paragraphs 9.42 to 9.44 of the Section 182 Guidance sets how the Authority should decide what actions are appropriate.

"9.42 Licensing authorities are best placed to determine what actions are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in their areas. All licensing determinations should be considered on a caseby-case basis. They should take into account any representations or objections that have been received from responsible authorities or other persons, and representations made by the applicant or premises user as the case may be.

9.43 The authority's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

9.44 Determination of whether an action or step is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives requires an assessment of what action or step would be suitable to achieve that end. While this does not therefore require a licensing authority to decide that no lesser step will achieve the aim, the authority should aim to consider the potential burden that the condition would impose on the premises licence holder (such as the financial burden due to restrictions on licensable activities) as well as the potential benefit in terms of the promotion of the licensing objectives. However, it is imperative that the authority ensures that the factors which form the basis of its determination are limited to consideration of the promotion of the objectives and nothing outside those parameters. As with the consideration of licence variations, the licensing authority should consider wider issues such as other conditions already in place to mitigate potential negative impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives and the track record of the business. Further advice on determining what is appropriate when imposing conditions on a licence or certificate is provided in Chapter 10. The licensing authority is expected to come to its determination based on an assessment of the evidence on both the risks and benefits either for or against making the determination."

12. Recommendation

- 12.1. The Sub-Committee determines the application in the light of written and oral evidence and resolves to take such steps as it considers appropriate and proportionate for the promotion of the licensing objectives of;
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder
 - b) the prevention of public nuisance
 - c) public safety

12.2. The steps that the Sub-Committee may take are:

- a) to grant the licence subject to such conditions as the authority considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, and the mandatory conditions
- b) to exclude from the scope of the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application relates;
- c) to refuse to specify a person in the licence as the designated premises supervisor;
- d) to reject the application.


Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.





The Waters Edge Cafe at number 19 Coombe Street has applied for a alcohol licence in addition to changing its opening hours. When the cafe first opened it was agreed with the landlord that the cafe would open from 9am till 5pm, as the cafe is in a residential area this would be the least disruptive to the neighbours.

This application to now serve alcohol and open till 9pm will be very disruptive. My husband and I both have jobs which start early in the morning, therefor we tend to go to bed fairly early, in addition the cafe seating area is within 1.5 metres from my door and I have no wish to have people sitting outside my house eating and drinking till 9pm. The cafe would then need to clean when the customers eventually left for the previous days trade, this could then become 10pm by the time the cafe closes. This cafe is within a mostly residential area and we object that granting this licence would be disruptive to the area.

Premises Licence Application for Mr Jason Dellbridge - 19 Coombe Street, Lyme Regis

Thank you for your e-mail of 13 October 2021 advising of the objection to the licensing application I have submitted on behalf of Mr Jason Dellbridge.

Through planning application number WD/D/20/000664 (as modified by application P-VoC-2021-00169) I obtained planning permission for the change of use of the ground floor premises at 19 Coombe Street to a café which predominantly sells hot and cold drinks, cold food and a limited range of hot food (warmed sausage rolls etc) for consumption on and off the premises.

The limited size of the premises restricts the number of people who can sit and consume their food and drink, whether inside the premises or outside on the small gravelled courtyard.

To protect the amenities of nearby residents Dorset Council imposed a planning condition on the planning permission, restricting the opening times of the café from 08:00 to 17:00 on Monday to Saturday and from 9:00 to 17:00 on Sundays and Bank Holidays.

As you are already aware the premises licence has been submitted to enable Mr Dellbridge to sell glasses of wine to those customers who would like a glass of wine with their food. There are no plans to sell beer, lager or spirits etc.

The premises licence application has been made to enable the sale of alcohol on any day from 11:00 hours to 21:00 hours.

Under the current planning permission, if the licence application was approved and Mr Dellbridge wanted the premises to remain open after17:00 hours another planning application, to vary the existing condition, would need to be submitted.

In their determination of such an application Dorset Council would again assess the impact on the amenities of nearby residents. If that impact was considered acceptable the application could be approved however, if the impact was considered to be unacceptable, the application would be refused.

As the legislative requirements and assessments of Licensing and Planning applications are distinctly separate, I do not consider it inappropriate to apply first for the licensing hours as per the current application and, at a later date, to apply to extend the opening hours.

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The alternative method, to apply for planning permission to extend the opening hours first would, in my professional opinion, be difficult to justify in absence of a premises licence.

I would be grateful if you could pass this letter to the objectors. I sincerely trust that the explanations given above will address their concerns and they will be able to see that the licence application is not a 'back door' means of turning the café into a public house or for the use of the premises, when licenced, to have an adverse impact on the amenity of local residents.

Should they need any further information or wish to discuss the licence application with me I would be happy for them to contact me directly. Alternatively, I would not consider it unreasonable should they wish all communication to be via you.

We would still like to register our concerns regarding granting an alcohol licence to Waters Edge Cafe.

The reason for this is this is still in a residential area and as the seating is as mentioned 1.5 meters from my door, which is my main entrance I would not feel comfortable or safe walking past people consuming alcohol especially when I have my grandchildren with me.

The current owner also has the business up for sale and although he has decided to not extend his opening hours if a licence was granted the new owner may have other plans.
