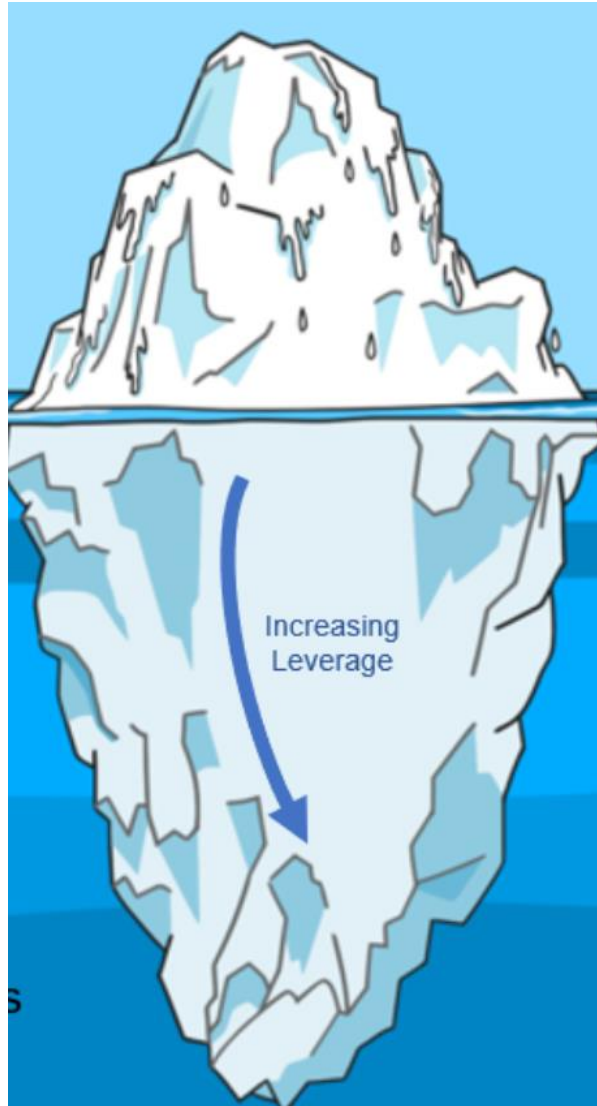

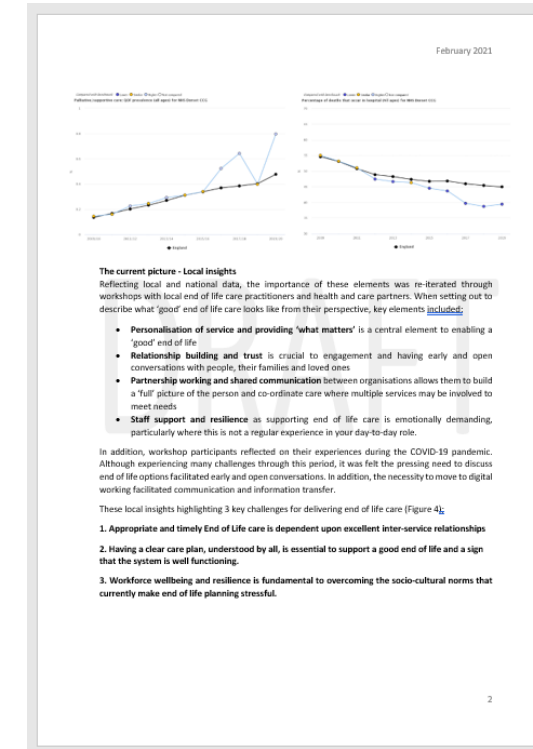
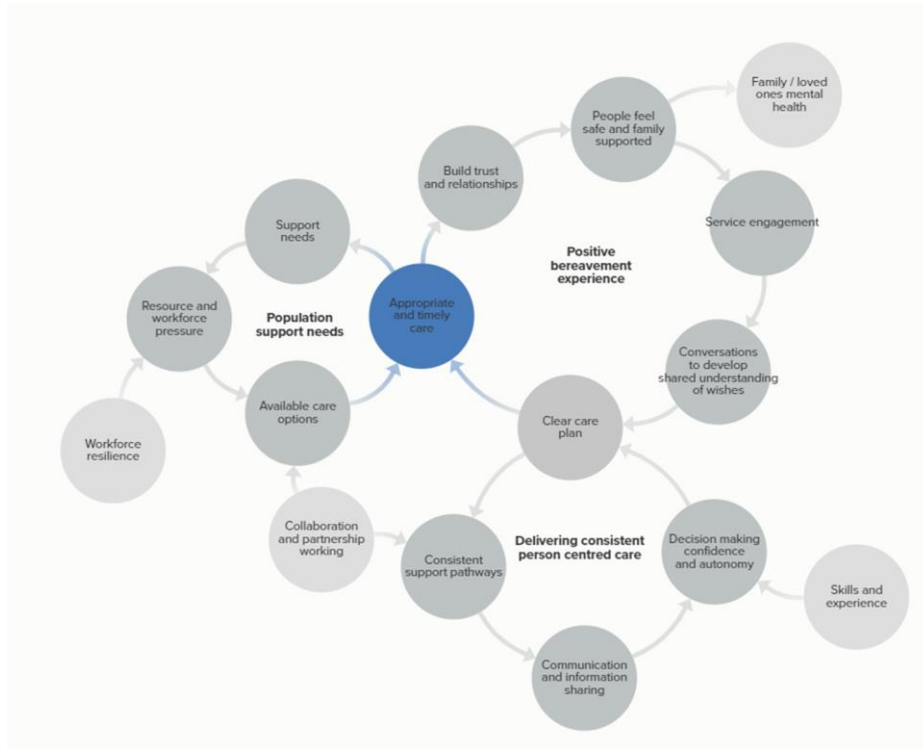
Where is the opportunity to influence our system
