

## Appendix 3 Representations

1	<p>I am writing to object to the extended outdoor licence to midnight at the Rising Sun in Wimborne on weekends on the grounds of public nuisance and noise. This public house is immediately adjacent to a residential area of 16 properties of which three have house walls as the immediate boundary, one is located less than 3m from the parking area in question and the rest of the properties are close enough from 4m to 20m as not to be able to have windows open because of noise. This is not a new issue having experienced noise and anti-social behaviour from fights to urinating! Many of our residents are elderly and this causes them stress and anxiety- listening to music and then angry voices as the night progresses. Whilst I accept this pub has been there for many years the fact is that this extension is intrusive into the expected reasonable life of immediate residents.</p>
2	<p>I live at xxx in a house adjoining the back wall of the Rising Sun's open area. I have just learnt that they are applying to stay open till midnight at weekends. I already hear loud voices from there throughout any fine day, which is bearable, even though there is often a loud repetitive bass beat which often continues to the present closing time but at least it stops then and I am pleased the customers are enjoying themselves. But I object to this proposed extension of hours as it is likely to increase the noise nuisance and adversely affect my quiet enjoyment when listening to TV, music or conversation in my own home and from getting to sleep at a reasonable time,</p>
3	<p>I would like to register a request not to grant the Rising Sun at Wimborne an extension to the later hours of trading, as they now have open pods in the what was the car park right next to the houses in Millstream close and already the noise has dramatically increased, this would just compound the issue. Already the bid have close off the access to Millstream close on all Sundays from May to August, again inconveniencing the home owners, we get no rate reduction etc. Just expected to put up with it. would you be happy to have less sleep at night if it was outside your house</p>
4	<p>I wish to raise the strongest objection to an application being made for a licence extension to midnight. As a resident at xxx we are immediately adjacent to the Rising Sun Inn who are making this application. We are already subject to noise and disturbance from these licensed premises during their current hours and unacceptable behaviour following closing time and would respectfully suggest that the residents here should not be expected to tolerate more.</p> <p>We are all sympathetic to the difficulties the hospitality trade are experiencing but this should not impact on those of us who are fortunate enough to live in Wimborne.</p> <p>I personally earnestly request that you refuse this particular application bearing in mind that often those who continue to drink until midnight in these circumstances may bring disrepute to what is regarded as a very desirable and unique ancient town</p> <p>Thank you for considering my request.</p>
5	<p>I am writing to object to the application to vary a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003 for the Rising Sun, 38 East Street, Wimborne.</p> <p>I object to their opening hours being extended and the possibility of them having outdoor entertainment until 1:30am. I currently live at xxx and have lived here for 12 years.</p> <p>I am extremely concerned that the loud volume of the music and people in the pub garden will keep not only keep my own children, but also other children who also live next door, awake until the early hours of the morning. Whilst I appreciate that all pubs are noisy, their current closing time is much more appropriate. I believe that this is against the licensing objective of protecting children from harm.</p> <p>From previous experience of having the nightclub "the Vibe Lounge" across the road from our flat, I am fully aware of the chaos and commotion heavily intoxicated people can cause when vacated from a premises at</p>

	<p>2am. I have witnessed many fights directly on my doorstep requiring emergency service attention and I firmly believe that this was due to the nightclub being open so late and being the only premises in town to be open so late. I believe this is against the licensing objective of preventing crime and disorder and public nuisance.</p> <p>During the Wimborne Folk Festival, the pub is usually open until very late. During those 3 days, I have lost count how many times I have witnessed and found evidence of intoxicated people urinating on my doorstep. I believe that this is due to the late night opening. Whilst I do not mind having to regularly disinfect my doorstep for 3 days over the festivities of folkie, I do not want to have to do this all year round and have to expect my 2 small children to "tiptoe" around pools of bodily fluids early in the morning. I believe that this is against the licensing objective of public safety and public nuisance.</p> <p>I love living here and raising my family in the heart of Wimborne. I even love living next to the Rising Sun. Hearing people happy and having fun in the garden is lovely! Especially after the year we've all had! The sound of a busy pub makes us feel that some normality is returning. We wouldn't have lived here for so long if we had a problem with it all. I just fear my children being kept awake at night and having to clean urine and vomit up all year round.</p> <p>I hope you can help me and will understand my concerns. Thank you for taking the time to read this.</p>
6	<p>I would like to submit my objection to: Premises licence number PL0155 On the basis of public nuisance and safety.</p> <p>As a neighbour and one whose home is directly attached to the outdoor dwelling in the Rising Sun car park, the sound and vibrations from the pub and outdoor area is already too loud.</p> <p>While the pub does seem to stop music by around 10/11pm on weekends, it would be impossible to ever get to sleep before then (let alone if you had babies/young children) and I feel sorry for those who work early or night shifts - of which there are some nearby.</p> <p>Those of us who live in rented flats next door don't have the luxury of double glazing windows or thick walls - even when a car door shuts in The garages beneath our flats, the floor shakes. You can imagine the impact of constant loud/live music right outside.</p> <p>To not be able to have relief until midnight for a few nights in a row every single week would be unbearable and unfair. There are three flats whose bedrooms are literally attached to the venue.</p> <p>Similarly, even when the music does stop, there are gatherings and people outside for at least another hour after close. We're less than a stones throw away so it's like having them on your front door step. Forget having the luxury of an open window unless you want to be part of every conversation. And forget going to bed until midnight as it already stands.</p> <p>I could understand the desire to have later opening times on certain dates/occasions but for this to be a regular thing would be completely unfair. While it's somewhat in the nature of living in the centre of town, there needs to be a mutual respect for our mental and emotional health, our homes and livelihoods.</p>
7	<p>I have lived at xxx for 14 years adjacent to The Rising Sun. Historically there have been many noise disturbances during that time, but largely acceptable.</p> <p>Given the proximity of my home to their extended outdoor entertainment area I feel that granting them the extra late night daily provision that they are applying for would be a retrograde step, and detrimental to the quality of life for the residents of Millstream Close.</p> <p>I realise that pubs have struggled during the Covid restrictions but with the end of all these in sight I fear the worst, namely that noise and disturbances will escalate from the Rising Sun's outdoor entertainment area; I haven't mentioned the residue that remains around the entrance to Millstream Close after some of the evenings' activities.</p> <p>As an elderly lady living alone I value my security and peace of mind. I don't want to feel intimidated and beleaguered in my own home.</p>

	Therefore I must object most strongly to the extension applied for by The Rising Sun.
