APPENDIX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. Designated Premises Supervisor

No supply of alcohol may be made under this premises licence -

WHERE THE PREMISES LICENCE AUTHORISES FOR THE SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under this premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 3. The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
- a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to -
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner
- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that -
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 -
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

P = D + (DxV)

Where -

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -
- (i) The holder of the premises licence
- (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

- Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:
- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
- (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
- 2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
- (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
- (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.
- 3. For the purposes of this section:
- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
- (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule

APPENDIX 2

1-This Premises Licence is used for a three day event, called Jurassic Fields Music Festival, that is to take place on the second Friday, Saturday and Sunday (from 2022) of July of each year only, with the first Event taking place on Saturday 12th July 2014.

2-A dedicated and detailed security plan including numbers of SIA security personnel, marshalls and where and at what times they are on duty and line of management and communication and their functions/tasks is produced by the Event Organisers, either by their team or by their employed Security Company. The Security Plan to incorporate procedures to follow if persons are required to be ejected from the site and also the procedures to follow about 'gate crashers'. For the Security Plan to be made available and to be briefed to the security personnel and marshallsl prior to the event taking place. The security plan to be made available to both Dorset Police and to the Local Authority no later than 2 two months prior to the event and will take into account any agreement reached between the Event Organiser and the Police regarding the provision of SPS (paid Special Police Services) each year.

3-No glass vessels to be used on site. All glass bottles to be decanted into plastic or polycarbonate vessels prior to handing over to customers.

4-A search policy to be clearly advertised to patrons, on terms and conditions, tickets prior to the event and also at the site public entrances.

5-No alcohol to be taken on or off site, only alcohol purchased on site to be available. Any alcohol attempted to be brought into the site and found upon entry by SIA security personnel, to be confiscated.

6-A detailed drugs policy to be created as to what to do with the confiscated drugs. This policy is to be issued no later than two months prior to the event taking place and made available to Dorset Police and the Local Authority.

7-A CCTV system will be erected at entrances/exits and will be capable of recording throughout the duration of the event and any recordings to be downloaded upon the request of Dorset Police. A nominated person will be responsible for the downloading and workings of the CCTV system throughout the event. The CCTV system will be capable of displaying clear head and shoulder coverage of persons entering/exiting the site

8-A detailed Traffic Management Plan to be submitted to the Police and Local Authority no later than two months prior to the event taking place. This Traffic Management Plan will address issues relating to the movement of vehicles used by persons attending the Event (including set up and break down of event, ie contractors) provision of transport including how people are to leave the premises once the event has finished, ie taxis, on foot what routes are to be taken and how the marshals are to interact with this function.

9-If requested, by the Local Authority for the Event Organisers to attend debrief meetings, as deemed necessary by the Local Authority.

- 10-A Challenge 25 policy to be implemented at all bars selling alcohol.
- 11-A nominated manager for each bar that is on site. He or she will be responsible for a refusals book for that particular bar.
- 12-A Personal Licence Holder dedicated to each bar on site.
- 13-Ticketing policy to include details of wristband types as mentions in annex 2 of the the event management plan (refering to alcohol sales).
