Hello

At the beginning of March I sent an objection to the above 4 day license being issued. It appears we have to let yourselves be aware of any cars, traffic issues separately. To this end I am writing to strongly object not only to the license but to the number of people and vehicles this event brings into our **village of just over 100 residents and no car parking facilities.**

This event has, we have been advised, has the potential for 1000 people plus their cars to attend. Parking for the Saturday is currently courtesy of our local farmer in a field on the other side of the village from the event site. **This is because there are no car parking facilities on site.**

All traffic coming into and exiting our village has an impact on practically the whole village. We have now had a one way system imposed for this year and beyond. However, since the beginning, the organisers have put their own

signs up directing traffic in a one way set up. Was this legal? Last year signs were left on the main lane into the village telling people where they could park overnight. Was this legal? Parking for any of the other days/events will not, we are told, be in the farmer's field. This has the potential to create parking problems.

This event has completely outgrown our village and should be relocated, but the organisers refuse to listen to this point of view which has been expressed by a number of residents.
