- 1) How will tickets be sold for the event to ensure your proposed numbers will not be exceeded and how will any people who turn up on the night be treated
- 2) How many SIA security staff will be employed at the event and where will they be positioned
- 3) Will a personal licence holder be running the bar and what measure both inside and outside the venue will be taken to prevent underage drinking
- 4) What is the age demographic of those expected to attend
- 5) What type of music will be played
- 6) What measures will be in place to prevent anti-social behaviour at the end of the event and dispersal of patrons will not cause issues to local residents
- 7) What time will the late night refreshment cease
- 8) What measure will be in place as regards the potential for drugs entering the venue
- 9) Why is a 03.00hrs finish needed
- 10) What plans for transportation at the end of the event are in place (are local taxi firms aware)
