Whilst I do not intend requesting your agreement to additional conditions for this licence I would like for you to be aware that during the period that the Live Music Act provides exemption you will still need to adhere to the prevention of public nuisance objective. This means that you should consider the volume, duration and frequency impact on neighbouring premises when you have regulated entertainment.

I would also like to advise you of the statutory nuisance regime (under Environmental Protection Act 1990 Part III), which requires the local authority to investigate noise from premises which may cause a nuisance to a complainant's property – there is no time restriction on this, like the exempted period. But should this be determined, a review could be sought and the exemption removed, with additional conditions placed on your licence.

I would advise that you consider what mitigation or monitoring you could put in place to contain/control the impact of regulated entertainment.
